Working with Swansea City Council to make sure event waste management fits with local systems



The blue carpet used at the event will be repurposed for future events and activities or recycled



Staff and volunteer kit is in line with British Triathlon event branding to ensure there is no unused kit from the event



Sustainable credential checks have been made before selecting hotel, food and drink suppliers



Accommodation within close proximity to the venue has been selected to reduce the need for transport services

Signage at the event site is part of British Triathlon's event supplies, reducing single-use and event specific signage



Refillable water points and water bottles will be used by volunteers and staff throughout the event



Promoting the use of public transport for staff, volunteers, participants and spectators across the event week

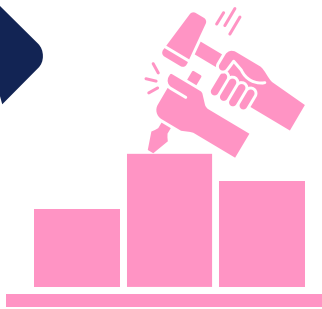
Use of local suppliers as a priority for procurement across event infrastructure and delivery
